 Ethan Murcia: Virtual settings have made it easier to connect in terms of connecting with alumni and companies. On the other hand, not many participants join Zoom calls making it harder to connect with one another.

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3. Velia Trujillo: Zoom required people to allocate people differently, and although helpful, it defeated the purpose of hosting events because students weren't able to interact as easily.

- How have you had to adapt events held by your organizations and campus?

- 1. Ethan Murcia: At the beginning, everything was moved to Zoom including concerts. Now that we're transitioning back there is still a delay in hosting in-person events for large groups.
- 2. Brent Valdez: General meetings were allowed to be proctored with a maximum of 50 to allow for social distancing. Have had to work with OSI for events with larger group events to plan accordingly and ensure COVID practices are in place.
- 3. Velia Trujillo: It's clearly visible that organizations are feeling the fatigue of having to plan events around the pandemic and having to restrict engagements to certain groups and numbers.

- How safe do you feel on campus?

- Ethan Murcia: Feels safe on campus and is part of the staff that is implementing prevention measures (signage, sanitation stations, etc.) to mitigate risk. Is able to interact with leadership and understand how they are preparing for return to in-person and referring to other campus studies.
- 2. Brent Valdez: Feels safes as generally interacts in small communities that take preventive measures and practice proper COVID-19 safety practices.
- Velia Trujillo: Feels thankful for the university's efforts, but the only concern is the confidence that all classmates are following proper procedures. The university provides a number of great resources.

- What would you want us (UCMAA Board) to do for you?

- Ethan Murcia: Would appreciate if alumni were tied to another organization that students could work with to reach out to alumni. It is difficult to take the first step when students want to be mindful of schedules that alumni are already tackling.
- Brent Valdez: Advertising especially in the STEM industry. Having UCMAA approach faculty to help promote the organization to students as a resources that is available to access. Even flyers and social media marketing would help.
- 3. Velia Trujillo: Advertising is important especially for the younger students to raise awareness about the resources available through the alumni association.

- 1. Derek: What is the best social media platform we can use to connect with you?
 - a. Ethan: Discord. Already involved in an Engineering discord channel with some alumni.
 - b. Brent: Discord is helpful because you can connect with large groups, but also Instagram and Facebook.
 - c. Velia: Agrees Discord would be easiest, but Instagram, Facebook and Twitter would be the easiest way to raise awareness.

- UCMAA Bylaw Amendment Proposal: Article V, Section 2 & 3
 - Section 2 amendments include:
 - 1. Former Directors of the Board be eligible to serve on the Nominating Committee
 - 2. Appointments be named during or around Bobcat Day for schedule flexibility
 - 3. The Nominating Committee may put forth a list of possible non-voting advisors pending the Board's approval
 - 4. Flexibility for the UCMAA Board to review the Board application and criteria any time prior to the opening of the applications within the current year (January—April)
 - Section 3 amendments include:
 - 1. The UCMAA Board's ratification vote will be a vote of confidence in the Nominating Committee's adherence to the process as defined by the bylaws
 - 2. A majority affirmative vote will be required to confirm regulations were met and the slate of nominees in total
 - 3. Any applying Director will abstain from voting due to conflict of interest
 - 4. If an affirmative majority vote is not reached under the guidance of the Executive Committee, there shall be an open consideration for additional review of deliberation notes of the Nominating Committee's adherence and and/or consideration of candidates
 - 5. The Board Secretary will have discretional authority to conduct a ratification vote via email or by other mean
 - Vote: Approval of the Bylaw Amendment Proposal
 - 1. Motion: Steven Barillas
 - 2. Second: Jonathan Ly
 - 3. Votes in favor (Yes): 13
 - 4. Votes against (No): 0
 - 5. Abstentions: 1 (Randell Rueda)
 - 6: Bylaws amendments were approved with an affirmation vote

UC MERCED FOUNDATION BOARD OF TRUSTEES UPDATE

- Board of Trustees Overview
 - Rodney Nickens, Jr. '09 started as Board of Trustees Alumni Representative in July 2021
 - The Alumni Representative role was first established in 2018
 - The Foundation was established in 2000 to raise and administer philanthropic support for the teaching, research, and service activities of UC Merced
 - The Foundation Board has 58 volunteers and 2 alumni members (one being the Alumni Representative)
- Board Structure
 - -Trustees serve on various workgroups to collaborate on the varying needs of the university:
 - 1. Advocacy & Awareness Work Group
 - a. Strengthens relationships with elected officials and builds connections within the state
 - b. Advises on key marketing opportunities and strategies
 - c. Assists in identifying opportunities to advocate on behalf of and promote UC Merced
 - 2. Connections & Mentorship Work Group
 - a. Supports and promotes the fundraising priorities for the institution
 - b. Raises external resources
 - c. Engages trustees in identifying and facilitating connections
 - 3. Entrepreneurial Ecosystem Work Group
 - a. Helps UC Merced build an environment that supports a pioneering and entrepreneurial mindset
 - b. Builds an A-list of industry partnerships
 - 4. Nominations Work Group
 - a. Works with campus leadership to identify board needs to inform strategic outreach and consideration
 - b. Carries out process for considering new trustees and term renewals
 - c. Supports engagement prior to, throughout, and following service
- Fundraising
 - The Board has an overarching focus on fundraising and maintains a goal of 100% Board participation in annual giving
 - Significant areas of contributions made by the Board:
 - a. \$500k+ to endow the Board of Trustees Presidential Chair, currently held by

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- b. \$200K+ to fund Mobi the Mobile Maker Lab, to promote STEAM education and provide hands-on learning opportunities for K-12 students in the region
- c. \$289K to the Merced Vernal Pools & Grassland Reserve, securing match funding from the State of CA
- The Board established an annual Trustees' Impact Fund to make a significant impact on an area of need on campus 1. So far the fund has been directed to support undergraduate research and study aboard experiences
- Board Engagement
 - Active participation in meetings
 - Stay up-to-date on the news, priorities, and needs of UC MErced
 - Attend and volunteer for other activities (Innovate to Grow, Grad Slam, UC Merced Advocacy Initiative, Commencement, speaker sessions, etc.)
 - Facilitate introductions
- Questions:
 - Randell: How can alumni and students connect with the Foundation Board?
 - 1. Reaching out to the board through the alumni representative (Rodney) and any trustee. Many have opened their homes to students. The staff are also very receptive and responsive to students.
 - Trustees have heard from students about the current needs through their participation in the virtual advocacy initiative. The June meeting will be held in-person and may provide an opportunity to invite students and alumni to engage with the board.
 - Keith: What is the application and selection process for the Board/Alumni representative role?
 - 1. A focus of the board is fundraising and is something that is reviewed when considering new candidates not only their personal philanthropic abilities, but the network they can bring in for additional partnership opportunities.
 - 2. For the Alumni representative role, the UCMAA Board is asked to provide nominations and put forth to the Foundation Board for final selection
 - Brooklynn: What are some of the goals you (Rodney) hope to accomplish through the role?
 - 1. Had a wonderful experience at UC Merced and many opportunities to participate in programs. Would like to ensure other African-American students like him can have the same opportunities and ensuring UC Merced is a welcoming and safe space for black students. Ensuring that diversity, equity and inclusion is central to everything the university does, and that it is a beacon of hope for students throughout California. Especially for those who are from low-income families.
