Scholars at Risk Fund Report | Amber Flores

- Fund Overview:
 - 1. Launched last year (2022), the fund provides scholars with temporary placement at UC Merced
 - 2. UC Merced is part of a greater UC Network that identifies and supports scholars
- Fund Impact:
 - 1. Thanks to the fund, Shiraz Noorani, an Afghan journalist, received a two-year fellowship and is currently attending UC Merced as a graduate student; read his full story online
 - a. Shriaz's two sisters Laila and Ghazal, also journalists, hold unpaid affiliate status with the Center for the Humanities where they have designated office space to work on their projects for the next two years
 - 2. Shiraz fled Afghanistan and in August 2021 he and his family were placed at a military camp in Indiana
 - 3. In January 2022, Shiraz and his family relocated to the Central Valley

 - 1. <u>Dinner for Champvocates</u>
 - a. Kick-off event for Student Philanthropy Month
 - b. Featured a panelist of speakers on the topic of philanthropic and non-profit work
 - i. Alumni Regent-Designate, Keith Ellis
 - ii. Executive Director and Campaign Manager, Amber Flores
 - iii. Entrepreneur, Mike Alamari
 - c. Keynote speaker: Michael Baldwin
 - Owner of a Central Valley non-profit that supports local youth of underserved communities and the reformation of individuals in prison to prevent recidivism

2. <u>Bobcats Give Back: Day of Service | Lake Yosemite</u>

- a. More than 70 students and alumni participated in trash clean-up and weed-pulling at the lake
- b. The event is hosted in partnership with the Community Engagement Center
- c. Over 400 collective service hours volunteered throughout the month of March

3. RCO Crowdfunding

- a. Over \$10,000 raised collectively
- b. A small portion of matching funds were provided this year, thanks to the Mackenzie-Scott donation
- c. Participating students organizations included:
 - i. Ballet Folklorico Support for cultural attire
 - ii. Black Student Coalition Support to develop a step program
 - iii. Bobcat Band Support to purchase new instruments
 - iv. Martial Arts Club Support to purchase new training equipment
 - v. Pilipinx American Alliance Support for additional cultural attire
 - vi. <u>Society of Hispanic Professional Engineers</u> Support for their "Manitos" student mentorship program

- Bobcat bricks

- 1. Bricks from 2017 2019 were installed in time for Bobcat Day
- 2. Bricks in honor of deceased Bobcats were designated by the office of Alumni Relations as part of the project

- Campus Updates

- 1. The "Open Paws" mural (painted outside of El Portal housing) will be debut in celebration of Bobcat Day
- 2. Two new sculptures of a "M" and "UCM," will be coming to campus; locations will be near the Biomedical Sciences & Physics (BSP) building and the Pavilion dining hall respectively
- 3. The Class of 2023 gift will be towards a new mural that will honor graduates and amplify the beauty of campus

- Regional Events

- 1. April 2, 2023: Merced Mixer
 - a. The Alumni Relations team hosted a networking mixer at M!X Downtown
 - b. Had a fantastic turnout and were able to engage a number of new Sacramento alumni
 - c. The event coincided with a regional admit reception hosted earlier in the day
- 2. September 15, 2023: Bobcats @ the Coliseum
 - a. The Oakland Athletics will play against the San Diego Padres
 - b. Tickets will include
 - i. Access to a private indoor/outdoor space
 - ii. A concession card available for use anywhere in the stadium
 - iii. Seats to the baseball game above the first baseline and on the second tier
 - iv. A fireworks show and a celebration of Latin music will be held right after the game

• Community Mobilization

- Eve is working on surveys with the office of Alumni Relations to form Chicanx/Latinx alumni affinity group
 - a. Eve will be actively networking with student groups for their insights during Bobcat
 - b. Student organizations will also be invited to attend focus sessions
- Jamie and JaeJae worked on a STEM event

• Connections & Mentorship

- A Chill and Chat pilot event was hosted on February 22 with the Living Learning Communities
 - 1. Randell and Gaby served as panelists for the pilot session
- Cristhian and Steven are working to launch the next phase of Bobcats Helping Bobcats
 - 1. Next Steps:
 - a. Survey alumni
 - b. Work on updated application to launch by August 15

• Giving & Gratitude

- Have had 92% of board members give to a meaningful fund/opportunity
- Working on an email to target class of 2007 alumni; aiming to have one alum from each class year donate (2006-2022)
- Planning a virtual collaboration event, details to be finalized
- The UC Merced Faculty and Staff of Color Association has taken lead on grad cap and gown support
- Currently working on details for a video campaign to support the Boldly Forward fundraising campaign

• DREAM TEAM Discussions

- Randell met with the Basic Needs office as a member of the Community Mobilization team
 - 1. The Basic Needs team now oversees the Professional Clothing Closet (PCC)
 - 2. The PCC is currently housed in the old den along with the Pantry; they are looking to expand the space
 - 3. An action committee will be formed to formulate a pitch to the Basic Needs office
 - 4. Discussions:
 - a. Jonathan: Would like to focus on more initiatives that demonstrate the impact of support for the campus through minor actions (e.g. resources to students/young alumni)
 - b. Liz: How bureaucratic does the board want to be? Are there opportunities to partner with local shops? (e.g. create a voucher/coupon program)
 - Randell: Intention is to support the office as a standalone entity on campus. Opportunities
 may include grassroots efforts for projects, or co-collaborating on project proposals
 that are shared with campus leadership.
- Katrina: Echoes Jonathan's sentiments about demonstrating impact through visuals such as social media or a reward/recognition system.
- Eve: Recommends having more information about where donations are being directed through tangible examples and success stories.
- Keith: Recalling efforts to leverage funds from the Journey Fund, the board may consider resuming discussions on the management of funds for opportunities to create impact (e.g. Professional Clothing Closet initial funding)
- Keith: During a March 2023 Regents meeting, attendees were informed about the UC Investment Academy student internship program funded by UC Investments at UCOP. The program is predominantly UC Merced students, but is open to all campuses.
 - 1. Challenges shared included a lack of women applicants, especially women of color
 - 2. Alumni Regent Amanda Pouchot (UC Berkeley alumna) expressed interest in developing an endowment at UC Merced to support efforts
