2. Spring Highlights

- a. Over 30 alumni participated in a feedback session for UC Merced's Strategic Plan through the event "Shaping Your Merced 2030"
- b. A total of 71 unique attendees participated out of 150 alumni RSVPs for the regional virtual events, "An Evening with Chancellor Muñoz,"
- c. A.L.U.M. Month kicked off with the Alumni Association Summit that marked the launch of the UCMAA Board applications
- d. This year's UC Merced advocacy initiative consisted of 18 virtual meetings led by Trustees and highlighting stories from students and alumni
- e. "Conversations with Campus Leaders" was a virtual series that highlighted Dean Gilger,
 Dean Matsumoto, and Dean Dumont as they presented updates regarding research and programs from their respective schools
- f. The UC Alumni Career Network will continue to host it's monthly webinar series, with UC Merced hosting the September webinar on non-tech jobs in the Tech industry
- g. The "Bobcat Walk: Stage Cross Opportunity" was an experience for the Spring 2021 graduates to celebrate their graduation in addition to the virtual ceremony

 - 1. Community Mobilization
 - a. Goal: Identify which communities we can impact positively, while bringing stakeholders together within our respective networks

 - ii. Advertise the importance of giving and demonstrate the impact on the campus and students
 - iii. Increase awareness among the current student population early on
 - c. Metrics:
 - i. Plant: Track share/engagement metrics through social media
 - ii. Grow: Track newsletter clicks/actions, as well as donors and donations
 - iii. Sustain: Track engagements

- Presentation led by Director of Medical Education, Dr. Thelma Hurd, and Dean of Natural Sciences, Dr. Betsy Dumont
- Alumni Hillary Brown and Marko Zivanovic joined the presentation
- Progress Update
 - Over the past year to 16 months, efforts have been focused on building the foundation that will support the inevitable UC Merced Medical School
 - Dr. Hurd has taken strides to build and strengthen partnerships within the health care community:
 - 1. UC Merced Partners
 - a. School of Natural Science
 - b. School of Engineering
 - c. School of Social Sciences, Humanities & Arts
 - d. Kolligian Library
 - 3. Health Sciences Research Institute

• Educational Initiatives

- LEAD Pre-Health: Leadership training for future healthcare professionals
 - 1. Partnership with the Office of Leadership, Service and Career
 - 2. The initial class of 30 had 70 applicants apply
 - 3. Brought in health care leaders from across the region from UC, Kaiser Permanente, Allied Health, physicians, and FQHC to learn about the business infrastructure that supports clinical training
- Pre-Med Central: Consists of 200 members and enables various student organizations to act as a unified force through their individual missions
- Society for Medical Sciences: Journal club that will launch in May
- SJV PRIME ARCH: Consists of a seminar series called "ALIGN" and the summer research program ASPIRE
- MCAT Preparation: Developed a collaboration with Kaplan and Pinesett Empowerment to provide exam preparation resources that will support students
- 2021-Clinical Immersion Experience (CIEx) Surgical Oncology
- Grand Rounds: Launched in Spring will continue to feature regional and national speakers
 - 1. Alumnus, Dr. Zi Wang '11 will provide an Stroke Management Update (June)





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- A Medical Education Advisory Committee consisting of faculty and advisors across campus has been established
- Planning to establish a Community Advisory Committee in 2022
- Working with Provost and Executive Vice Chancellor Greg Camfield to establish a Medical Education Office
- Developing an outreach program for high school students that is academic focused
- Established the Medical Education Collaborative website

- The UCSF-UC Merced joint program will advance health worldwide through research/inquiry, health professions education and teaching, public service, and excellence in patient care

Project Charter to establish partnership (UCSF-UC Merced)

- Early Acceptance Model—8 Year BS/MD Program
 - 1. Year 1-4: Undergraduate Degree UC Merced
 - 2. Year 5-6: Preclinical Sciences (18 months) UC Merced
 - 3. Year 6-8: Clinical Sciences (30 months)
- Expand to include community college students
- Proposed Timeline

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2. 2020-2023	Build UC Merced-UCSF infrastructure to support medical education
3. 2023	First cohort BS-MD program students at UC Merced; will consist of 12 students
4. 2027	First cohort BS-MD preclinical medical training at UC Merced
5. 2029	BS-MD cohort begins clinical rotations at UCSF Fresno
6. 2030	First BS-MD cohort graduates; Secure accreditation for UC Merced/UCSF Fresno Medical Degree

• Open Discussion

- Hillary inquired if Grand Rounds were open to the public?
 - 1. Dr. Hurd confirmed attendance is limited to invite only but asked alumni to reach out to her with their contact information to be included in future communications
- Alvin asked how it was decided that 12 per cohort was the ideal enrollment number?
 - 1. Dean Dumont shared it is based on the current financial model they are working under
 - 2. Dr. Hurd added that training slots for students need to be confirmed upfront and hopes that in the future enrollment could grow beyond the 12 based on that factor
- Marko asked what the vision beyond MD accreditation would be when it comes to programs like pharmacy and non-MD education fields?
 - 1. Dr. Hurd confirmed it is too early to say, but it optimistic that focus will shift after accreditation is achieved by the projection year of 2030
- Randell asked if searches for more student support liaisons (e.g. Student Affairs) is underway?
 - 1. Dr. Hurd welcomed suggestions and advise as they prepare for the first cohort of students in 2023
- Brenda asked if the UC Merced medical education opportunity will be strictly for BS-MD program students?
 - 1. Dr. Hurd confirmed that is the case as the BS-MD students will receive a degree from the UCSF School of Medicine through the current planned model; UC Merced graduates are encouraged to apply to UCSF directly
- Brooklynn asked what incentives or long-term programs will be placed to retain graduates in the Central Valley?
 - 1. Dean Dumont shared research suggests doctors often stay in areas where residency is completed, but considerations are being made for retention
