- · Charles Nies, Vice Chancellor of Student Affairs
 - Campus Rankings & Stats:
 - 1. #60 ranking in U.S. News and World Report (#93 in previous year)
 - 2. #28 among public universities ranking in U.S. News and World Report
 - 3. #7 among California public universities
 - 4. #4 in social mobility ranking in U.S. News and World Report
 - 5. 69% graduation rate (higher than national averages, esp. when considering demographics)
 - 6. 30% of our students continue to graduate programs
 - Fast Facts:
 - 1. 9,148 total enrolled (8,373 undergraduate, 775 graduate)
 - 2. 48% female and 52% male
 - 3. 18,291 degreed alumni
 - 4. 636 faculty and academic appointments
 - 5. 1,283 staff
 - 6. Slight drop in enrollment of first-gen and Pell-grant eligible students (sharper decrease nationally)
 - Growth:
 - 1. Engineering enrollment has increased
 - 2. Have seen more students from the SF-Oakland Bay Area
 - 3. Proportion of Central Valley students that enroll in UC doubled during the presence of UC Merced
 - a. Vanessa: Are there supports for students for enrollment?
 - i. Charles: Yes, we provide fee waivers, automatic admissions systems, guarantee pool (only at UC Merced since 2008)
 - Curriculum Updates
 - 1. 5 New Majors for 2023:
 - a. Biochemical and Biomolecular Engineering
 - b. Chemical Engineering
 - c. Data Science and Analysis
 - d. Data Science and Computation
 - e. Environmental Humanities
 - 2. Note: UC Merced will be adding 5 new majors each year over the next 5 years to reach 20 new majors
 - 3. Questions:
 - a. Cristian: How are new majors identified?
 - i. Charles: We look into research data from workforce needs and development to identify where there is a demand, and look at how those majors may be added without having to create a new program to house it; we also consider how it will contribute to the research that we do at UC Merced
 - b. Miguel: How are current programs affected?
 - i. Charles: It depends on the Faculty and the type of courses that are added to the curriculum

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- c. Liz: Are we getting new buildings or expanding classes? How are we recruiting the staff to teach the classes?
 - i. Charles: Through building projects. In discussion are the medical education building, COB3, and joint-housing (with Merced College). UC Merced recruits faculty nationally (with draw of California values).
- d. John Nguyen: Will there be more advisors to support the addition of new majors?
 - i. Charles: We will be doing a study on academic advising this year and find what makes the most sense to move forward; Centralized first-year advising has been successful in the past
- Pre-Med Cohort (BS-to-MD Pathway)
 - 1. 15 students out of 1200 applicants selected
 - 2. A medical building is in discussion and may be operational as early as Fall 2026
- Belonging and Engagement
 - 1. What does sense of belonging really mean?
 - 2. Students feel nervous about engagement due to their background and have a "just go to school" view (i.e. how to advocate for college life)
 - 3. Clubs, organizations, activities, and events are available for all students to participate in
 - 4. Student Engagement HUB
 - a. The HUB is a "one-stop" shop for students to connect with each other and learn more about the experimental learning opportunities that the university provides:
 - i. Internships, Education Abroad, Undergraduate Research, Community Engagement, Leadership Development
 - ii. Offers graduation pins of high impact engagement practices (HIPs)
- Over 60% of students participate in volunteer activities
- 42% of UC Merced undergraduates are involved in research

 the UC systemwide statistics around federal financial aid programs that we utilize here at the University
 of California; we have asked the 10 president associations to take this letter and make it specific to their
 campus
- Randell: As individual board members you can choose to voice your own opinion regarding federal work support, and we can get you connected, not only with Miguel and Cristian, but with Cori Lucero, our campus Government Relations representative, so that you can navigate that space, get connected with UCOP, and be part of the package of letters that will be sent
