- Background

- 1. UCSF Assistant Dean for Undergraduate Medical Education at UC Merced
- 2. Named UC Merced Director of Medical Education as of December 2023
- 3. Worked at UCSF for 20 years, practices at UCSF's Refugee Clinic
- 4. Served on taskforce transition of SJV PRIME from UC Davis to UCSF
- <u>SJV PRIME+</u>
 - 1. Includes the baccalaureate education of the student experience
 - 2. Launched in 2023, the program selected 15 students out of 1,226 applicants from the Central Valley a. The inaugural cohort of students is expected to enter medical school by 2027
 - 3. Introduced the second cohort of BS-to-MD students at Bobcat Day
 - 4. Students will spend their first 1.5 years of medical school at UC Merced and transition to UCSF for clinical
 - 5. The program BS-to-MD pathway aims to address the shortage of doctors in the Central Valley

- Health Scholars

- 1. To support the greater population of students on the pre-med track, UC Merced launched a "Beyond the MD: Biomedical Sciences & Health Professions" living learning community (LLC)
- Open Discussion
 - 1. SJV PRIME+ is building in support within the program (e.g. student navigator position) for those who may not graduate within the 4 years
 - 2. Groundbreaking for the Medical Education Building is scheduled for May 14
 - a. The building will house various health related majors (e.g. psychology, public health, etc.)

 - 1. Professor of Law and Director of the New American Legal Clinic (NALC) at San Joaquin College of Law
 - a. Goal: Build a pipeline of future attorneys
 - b. Currently mentoring/working with two fellow UC Merced alumnae:
 - i. Jessica Jaramillo Perez '14 ii. Alejandra Zurita '20
 - 2. Has served as the Alumni Representative on the UC Merced Foundation Board since October 2023
 - Board of Trustees
 - 1. The UC Merced Foundation Board of Trustees (BOT) is comprised of business and community leaders from across the state and nation
 - a. Trustees are appointed to a 3-year term
 - 2. Currently consists of 50 volunteers, 2 of which are alumni members
 - 3. The roles of the trustees include:
 - a. Engagement: Participating in meetings/work groups, attending events, and identifying nominees
 - b. <u>Philanthropic Leadership</u>: Building a culture of philanthropy, contributing annually to the Trustee's Impact Fund, and promoting philanthropic priorities
 - c. <u>Advocacy:</u> Advocating for UC and UC Merced, and staying informed about issues affecting the campus, system, and higher education
 - d. <u>Governance:</u> Provide input and strategic guidance to support fundraising goals and board operations

 - 1. 2014 2015: Establishment of the Board of Trustees Presidential Chair
 - 2. 2016 2018: Funding of Mobi the Mobile Maker Lab
 - 3. 2019 2020: Funding in support of the Merced Vernal Pools & Grassland Reserve
 - 4. 2021: Funding towards Student Success programs
 - 5. 2022: Funding of the Undergraduate Research Opportunities Center

 - Since 2020, the campaign has received 4,787 alumni gifts through 4,064 alumni donors
 - Since 2020, alumni have endowed 13 new funds to support student excellence
